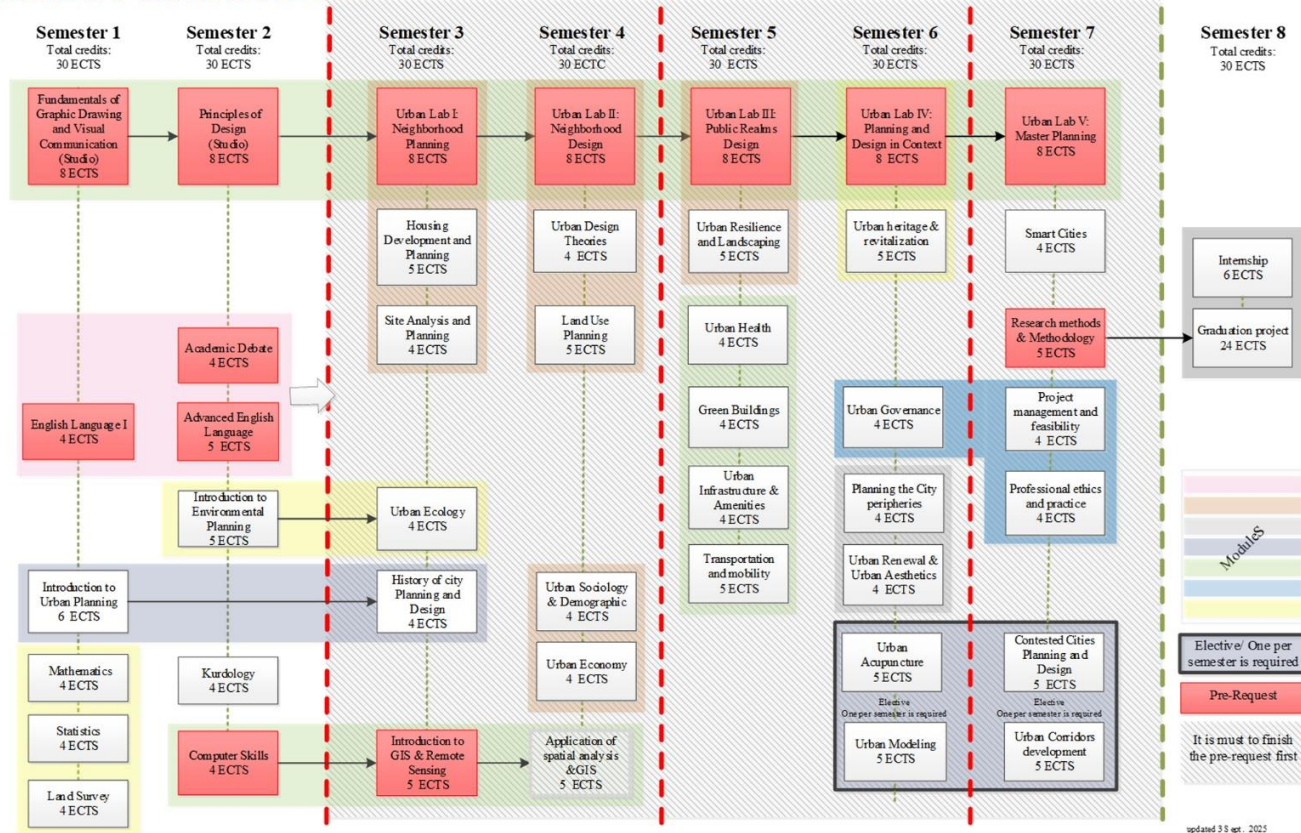

PROGRAM OVERVIEW: BSC IN CITY PLANNING

Study Duration:

The program is organised into **4 years**, Focusing on **City Planning and Design** courses with a **BSc thesis**.

Program Contents:

The study is organised according to the Bologna process and it has **8 semesters (240 credit points)**.

Acceptance Criteria:

Minimum accepted 12th grade Average: **80%**, with the total grades of Math and Physics subjects being not less than **70%** respectively.

Tuition Fees:

Students do not pay any tuition fees (the program is FREE). Students can apply through Zankoline and get accepted based on their average.

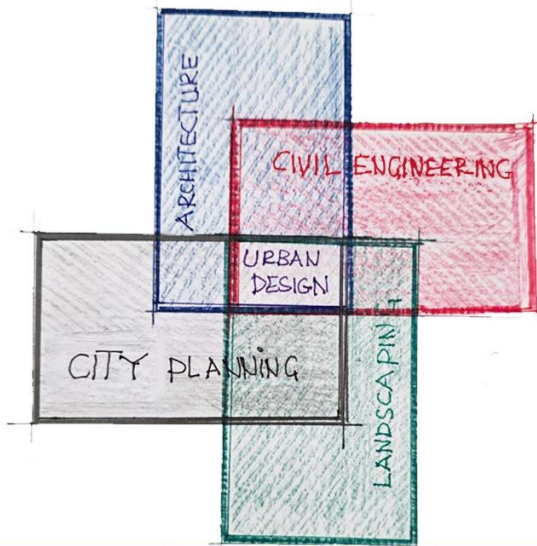
OVERVIEW OF THE STUDY PROGRAM
